CARES Act HEERF Student Share Grant: 30 Days Report

Report Date: August 14, 2020

On March 27, 2020, the federal government enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). Section 18004 of the CARES Act establishes the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF). The HEERF provides emergency funding to institutions of higher education, including funds that must go directly to students in the form of emergency financial aid grants for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the coronavirus, including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child-care.

Ohio Medical Career College (OMCC) provides the following information as required by the US Department of Education in order to comply with the reporting requirements under the CARES Act. This is OMCC's second 45-day progress report and presents information as of August 14, 2020. Additional reports will be provided every 45 days.

1. Certification & Agreement:

OMCC signed and returned the Student Aid Portion of the Funding Certification and Agreement to the Department of Education on June 3, 2020. OMCC signed and returned the Institutional Portion of the Funding Certification to the Department of Education on June 5, 2020. OMCC intends to use no less than 50 percent of the total funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.

2. Total Funds Received:

OMCC has received a total of \$246,076 under section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund. Of these funds, \$123,038 (50%) has been allocated to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

3. Total Funds Distributed to Date:

Ohio Medical Career College has distributed \$93698.55 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of August 14, 2020.

4. Estimated Number of Eligible Students:

OMCC has determined that approximately 130 students are eligible under Section 484 in the Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965. These students are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

The \$123,038 will be divided among these eligible students based on need and expenses accrued due to the coronavirus. Among eligible students, their financial need is taken into account to determine if they will receive a direct grant or must apply for the funding. Pell eligible students will receive direct grants. Other Title IV students who are not Pell eligible must apply for funding.

5. Number of Students Who Have Received HEERF Student Share Grants:

As of August 14, 2020, OMCC has provided 99 students with an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. Each student received a direct grant in the amount of \$946.45.

6. Method of Determining Which Students Would Receive HEERF Student Share Grants:

Students had to be enrolled in at least one on-campus class at the time of the transition of campus operations and have to be Title IV eligible to qualify for the funds. Students who dropped all classes before this date would not be eligible.

OMCC will award and distribute the HEERF student grants with a hybrid approach. Pell eligible students received a direct grant and all other eligible students must apply for the funds. The student allocation of \$123,038 was split 90% for Pell eligible students and 10% for all other Title IV eligible students.

Students who are not Pell eligible must submit an application detailing the expenses incurred related to the disruption of campus operations due to the coronavirus. OMCC will validate each student's eligibility by reviewing each application and supporting documentation. OMCC will assign awards based on the students need, the costs reported, and the number of applications received. Applicants will be considered on a first-come first-serve process, and when funds are depleted the program will end. No student will be awarded more than the expenses incurred as reported on their application.

7. Instructions, Directions, & Guidance Regarding HEERF Student Share Grants

OMCC notified all eligible students of the HEERF availability by email and on OMCC website. OMCC has also informed students who are Pell eligible by email that they were awarded these direct grants and did not need to submit application.

All other Title IV eligible OMCC students can apply for funds through the Student Financial Aid Office by submitting an application. The application verifies the eligible expenses students incurred related to the disruption of OMCC campus operations due to coronavirus, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care.
